THE COOPERATIVE MOVEMENT

- Its current form goes back to France and Great Britain at the end of the 18th. Its long history is documented on the ICA's website here
- A recent form of company in France (July 2001)
- Cooperatives operate in a number of very different fields and these organizations are characterised by their social utility, governance model and their specific mode of organisation



KEY FEATURES

- A vocation of collective interest: they are aimed to serve the common good and address collective needs, rather than focusing on individual profit or private gain
- Multi-partnership: the cooperative model makes it possible to associate multiple actors in different categories around the same project.
- Horizontal decision making: Its mode of organisation, which is based on the principles of solidarity and democracy, and on the principle of 1 member = 1 vote, with the possibility of weighting votes by forming colleges.
- Non-profit operation: the obligation to pay at least 57.5% of its annual surplus to a
 « non-shareable » reserve, which will never be distributed for personal enrichment but
 reinvested in the activity

Build sustainable perspectives for cultural places

 the occupation of cultural Alternative cultural places remains precarious: the pressure of land weakens their working conditions and diverts them from their objective of general interest.

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BUILDING OUR ACTIONS

La Main support and helps Cultural Third Places towards common ownership: together, we imagine modes of acquisition that are non-speculative and collective!

- Help and support: To support artistic and cultural places, to protect them from the precariousness of transitory urbanism and speculation of the real estate market.
- Experiment: To organize collective ownership of Cultural Third Places for a sustainable collective future
- **Raise awareness**: To facilitate networking, exchange of practices, cross-fertilization between the cultural actors and social real estate actors through an open and contributive resource center.

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A PARTICIPATORY WORK SPACE

- La Main has chosen the legal form of a cooperative of collective interest (SCIC), a specific social and solidarity legal form facilitating the active participation of all stakeholders in its governance
- The SCIC embodies La Main ambition for sustainable and fair Alternative & Independant Cultural Places
- Horizontal decision-making is a key ingredient : participation to the cooperative governance does not depend on the number of shares: one person, one vote!
- The members support the cooperative financially, volunteer for its development, and share their expertise, knowledge, know-how and ideas, and expectation for a sustainable future
